RESEARCH & INNOVATION

The **Carolina Research Venture Fund** was established in January 2015 to help move ideas from UNC-Chapel Hill labs to the commercial marketplace, one of the most important benefits Carolina can provide to the people of North Carolina and beyond

Over **\$428 million** awarded to researchers by the National Institutes of Health (NIH) in 2014

For fiscal year 2014:

- **156** invention disclosures
- **142** patents filed, **34** patents issued
- **\$7.9 million** in license revenue
- **\$3.2 million** in total expenditure on patents

In March 2015, the UNC Eshelman School of Pharmacy joined Monash University in Melbourne, Australia, and University College London in England to create the Pharmacy Alliance—a premier partnership to advance research, education and practice in pharmacy and the pharmaceutical sciences

More than **\$7 billion** in annual revenue generated in North Carolina from Carolina-based start-ups

UNC-Chapel Hill research and entrepreneurial students and faculty have founded more than **150** active businesses, creating nearly **8,000** jobs in North Carolina and **38,000** jobs worldwide

1st among the nation's public research universities according to *The Top American Research Universities* in 2012 (8-way tie)

\$792.7 million in total research funding for fiscal 2014; supports more than 10,000 positions in North Carolina
